
NYFB released its state legislative priorities for 2018 that seek to address the significant loss in farm incomes that will occur across the state. They include: doubling the minimum wage tax credit for farms; supporting and securing strong funding for the Environmental Protection Fund so we can support water quality and farmland protection funds, especially for additional manure storage; advocating for additional funds for Cornell that would update critical infrastructure to allow important research and extension work to continue, just to name a few. We will also be working hard to keep the line items in the budget that our industry relies so heavily on. Please visit www.nyfb.org for details on all these issues and more.

NYFB will advocate for these and other issues during the current legislative session. This effort will include hundreds of farmers who will visit Albany to meet with legislators during the organization's annual Taste of New York Reception and Lobby Day, March 5-6, 2018.

Examples of eligible repairs include, but are not limited to: bathrooms, plumbing, laundry facilities, recreation rooms, upgrading kitchens and appliances, heating, floors, walls, windows, ceilings, doors and other major structural components. Special consideration will be given to projects that positively impact the quality of life for farmworkers during off work hours. Farm owners must agree to provide \$1 for every \$1 provided by PathStone Corporation. This grant is available in Monroe, Wayne, Ontario, Orleans and Genesee Counties. The application deadline is March 15, 2018 and the work will need to be completed by June 7, 2018. Please help us spread the word as we want to assist as many farms as possible!

WHY IS FARM BUREAU SO IMPORTANT?

Here are a few past successes and current issues:

NEW YORK

- Enactment of a 2% tax cap and agricultural assessment cap.
- Enactment of the farmers' school property tax exemption, saving farmers millions on their tax bill.
- Ten-year real property tax exemption on new farm buildings to facilitate farm updates and growth.
- Lead the charge to accomplish inherent risk reforms for equine, u-pick and agritourism industry.
- Expanded the ability for farms to use renewable energy installations, such as anaerobic digesters, solar arrays and wind.
- Leading the charge to increase the estate tax threshold in New York to over \$5,000,000.
- Working to combat expanded labor mandates, improve access to agricultural education and implement infrastructure parity between downstate and upstate.
- Maintained exemption for 150 air mile radius in relation to "hours of service" trucking requirements.
- Works to maintain the agricultural sales tax and diesel fuel tax exemptions.

NATIONAL

- Constantly advocates tax landscape for famers including permanent section 179 expensing and bonus depreciation to name a few.
- Working to reduce regulatory impacts on our farms including: WOTUS- "Waters of the U.S." rule, ensuring access to biotechnology and monitoring FSMA implementation to ensure FDA provides information to states to implement the rule fairly and consistently.
- Action on a Modern Highway Funding Bill which will provide long-term certainty of funding, more flexibility for states and local governments, and streamlines the project approval process.
- Passage of the Trade Promotion Authority (TPA), paving the way for modern deals to grow markets.
- Repeal of the mandatory County of Origin Labeling provisions.

This year's Agricultural Literacy Week book, "Before We Eat: from Farm to Table" by Pat Brisson, displays the vast opportunities and diversity that New York agriculture encompasses. Students will be taken on a journey from farm to table to understand the different aspects of agriculture and the many possible careers involved. This is a captivating glimpse into what it takes to bring the food we eat to us in order to nourish our bodies and spirits. Genesee County Farm Bureau has purchased 12 books again this year, which will be distributed to volunteers who will read to students in area elementary schools.
