North Country Farmers Advocate for Agriculture

Members from Jefferson County Farm Bureau recently spent time at the State Capitol meeting with lawmakers to advocate for public policy priorities that reinvest in our family farms and open up new markets for New York farm products. Members kicked off the two-day trip with New York Farm Bureau's annual Taste of New York reception, a popular event attended by elected officials and decision makers. Jefferson County Farm Bureau's booth provided samples of Black Sheep Root Beer from Otter Creek Winery in Philadelphia and cheese curd from the Great Lakes Cheese Company in Adams. Representatives spent a full day attending meetings with Senators and Members of the Assembly, not only with our own elected officials, but also with New York City legislators. They gave each lawmaker an honest assessment of the additional economic pressures

family farms have been facing over the past two years, including low commodity and milk prices and rising labor costs. They discussed the need for a state budget that invests in critical research, promotion, farm safety and educational programs, clean water infrastructure and the Environmental Protection Fund and legislation to offset the harmful effects of the minimum wage increase.
