You have an idea about how to improve agriculture:


- Talk with your fellow members

- Local resolutions become county Farm Bureau policy and are submitted to NYFB Resolutions Committee to be considered at the State Annual Meeting in December



Should New York State Department of Environmental Conservation have a streamlined permitting process for farmers to complete work in water bodies?

Should New York Farm Bureau support legislation offering undocumented residents the ability to obtain a "standard" driver's license?

Should the quarterly employer payroll threshold for unemployment insurance for agricultural labor be increased from \$20,000? If so, what should it be increased to?

If New York State legalizes the recreational use of marijuana, how should New York farmers play a role, if any, in the regulatory process, production and distribution?

Should a milk support program be created similar to the Cotton Ginning Cost Share program?
