State Reaffirmations

Rural Health Care pg. 130 Entire section on rural health care.

Economic Issues/Liability Insurance

We recommend the repeal of Labor Law 200, 240 and 241 and the strict liability placed upon contractors and owners of commercial property.

State New

Transportation/EDL

We support overhauling the EDL guidelines to exempt all agricultural commodities.

Agricultural Economic Development

We support the expansion of state budget funding used for new and beginning farmers and veteran farmers to be expanded to other agricultural economic development programs including allowing current farmers to use these funds to diversify or expand into new agricultural enterprises.

Resolutions (cont'd):

<u>Labor</u>

We oppose the proposal for three-month bereavement pay.

We support companies that are committed to "social justice" to take it upon themselves to provide paid time off for employees as part of their compensation and benefit package, but oppose any effort to mandate it for all companies within the state.

Cooperative Extension

We support doubling the funding level from \$4 million to \$8 million for county cooperative extension associations through county law 224, which has remained unchanged since 1994 in the SUNY system budget.

New York Farm Bureau 2018 Legislative Successes

New York Farm Bureau had a very productive legislative session this year. A number of priority issues became law or were funded in the state budget. Here are the highlights:

- Extension of the 10-year property tax exemption on new or partially reconstructed farm buildings.
- Renters of leased farmland can now submit their agricultural assessment renewals electronically.
- Increased the speed limit at which slow moving vehicles with an attached SMV emblem may travel on roadways.
- Inherent risk legislation which will limit liability on equine, u-pick Christmas trees and agritainment operations.
- A six-year property tax exemption for newly-planted hopyards.
- Legislation that will allow craft beverage makers to produce and sell beer and cider infused ice cream.
- Five million dollars to improve infrastructure at county fairs.
- A nine percent increase in funding for NY FarmNet.
- Increased funding for the Environmental Protection Fund.
