Applicant Guideline

- 2019 graduating high school seniors who will continue their education to prepare for a career in some way connected to the diverse agricultural industry.
- Live or work on a farm or be involved with agriculture through any avenue.
- Family Farm Bureau membership or student Farm Bureau membership is required and may accompany application

Process and Procedure

- Applications and information available at <u>www.nyfb.org</u> or request by calling 1-800-342-4143.
- Students are required to complete an application which is a fillable pdf available on the NYFB website and submit a brief 300-500-word essay discussing an issue facing agriculture in their county, explaining how they think NYFB can support members who may deal with this issue.
- Completed application packets must be returned to New York Farm Bureau in Albany. A March 1, 2019 postmark deadline or via email.
- A district level competition will be held. Scoring will determine the county winners as well as the district winner. The judging event may necessitate a personal interview and essay presentation or may be based solely upon the application and attachments. The judging will take place prior to April 20, 2019. Each district winner will receive \$100 plus a memento of their selection.

State winner selection will be made from district winners, based solely on the submitted applications; there will be no personal interviews.

The program will continue to bring the best local experience, academic resources, and research-based solutions to Cayuga County's farms and communities.

For those of you who do not yet know Ron, he recently retired after 12 years as the Dairy and Livestock Educator for CCE Jefferson County, a dairy county remarkably similar to Cayuga. Over the past few years, work and research have included forage storage management, first cutting alfalfa harvest management, dairy replacement and transition groups, grazing, ventilation, and dairy/beef calf crosses. On the livestock side, Dairy and Beef Quality Assurance and feeder calf grading and marketing, along with some research on artificial insemination with sheep.

Prior to his role with Extension in northern New York, Ron worked for nearly 20 years in feed sales and nutrition with Hewitt Bros. in Locke, NY. He has lived in Cayuga County for most of his professional career, involved in all phases of dairy farming.

A Message from Congressman John Katko



As Representative for New York's 24th Congressional District in Washington, it is my honor to advocate on behalf of farmers in Onondaga, Cayuga, Wayne, and Oswego Counties. I'd like to take a moment now to update you on some of the recent accomplishments that impact our local agricultural community.

At the end of the 115th Congress, legislation that improves the New York farming industry was signed into law. The 2018 Farm Bill addresses critical agricultural issues facing Central New York farmers. Importantly, the new Farm Bill protects crops and boosts trading opportunities.

The new Farm Bill expands insurance for a wide variety of crops produced in Central New York. In particular, dairy farmers will benefit tremendously from the implementation of the Dairy Margin Coverage Program. This updated insurance policy provides dairy farmers more efficient coverage and an increased list of options, allowing farmers to be compensated when margins are low or products are spoiled by disaster. It also presents the opportunity to choose the insurance policy that best suits their particular needs as a farmer. Traditional crop insurance for farmers

of all backgrounds is also provided, doubling the disaster assistance coverage options for crops not eligible for insurance. Additionally, \$2.4 billion will be invested in pest research and management, supporting Central New York vegetable and fruit growers, especially apple growers. The application of these various programs will give our farms the ability to better protect their goods in the future.

Next, our local farms receive much needed trade relief under this version of the Farm Bill. Over the next decade, \$500 million will be allocated to help farmers across the country connect with foreign consumers. This will boost export opportunities for Central New York farmers of all kinds and increase sales. I am hopeful this policy, along with the establishment of the new United States-Mexico-Canada trade agreement and the rollback of unfair Canadian dairy tariffs, will bring financial success to Central New York farmers.

Central New York will be greatly impacted by all these new policies in the 2018 Farm Bill. Since coming to Congress, I have made it a priority of mine to support Central New York's agricultural economy in Congress. It was important to me that the policies outlined above were included in this legislation. I firmly believe Central New York will thrive in many ways as a result of this Farm Bill and I look forward to continue legislating in Central New York's best interests in 2019.
