#### DAY AT THE FARM TOUR SCHEDULED

This year, New Hope View Farms LLC, in partnership with Cortland County Farm Bureau, will be hosting the annual “Day at the Farm Tour” on Thurs., June 13, for the entire kindergarten class at Homer Central School. Last year, approximately 135 students attended with chaperones and family members. This year, approximately 150 students are expected to attend.

Typically, there are four stations set up at the farm:

- An animal exhibit, where students can see and pet baby animals including calves, sheep and chickens. Our neighbors from UpHill Angus generously donate their time and animals for this exhibit.
- An equipment station, where students can look at and climb into the seat of a few pieces of machinery while volunteers and farm employees talk about what the equipment is for.
- A milking station, where students can watch live above the parlor while cows are being milked.
- The Cortland County Dairy Princess is anticipated to attend and hand out chocolate milk and cookies donated by Trinity Valley Dairy at the fourth station. The students will also each receive a farm coloring book and cow pencil to take home.



At the 2018 “Day at the Farm Tour”, children were able to learn about and explore different pieces of equipment used on the farm.

This year we are looking forward to more volunteers and possibly a fifth station for the children to see what cows eat.
