

Young Farmers Update

In February, NYFB's Young Farmers & Ranchers held their annual leadership conference in Albany at the Desmond Hotel. It was a two-day conference with many exciting events and topics covered. I thought the conference was very beneficial and provided me with networking opportunities with young farmers from across the state. Attendees spoke with New York State Commissioner of Agriculture & Markets, Richard Ball, who talked about some future programs for people who want to farm. We also heard from keynote speaker Vance Crowe, who talked about how young farmers can tell a story about their farms in a way that would make consumers listen and relate to the challenges they are experiencing.

The young farmers also toured three local agribusinesses:

- Capital Roots Urban Grow Center, which helps farmers around the area sell fresh products to people in the urban community. The organization started in a small abandoned house and now has its own building and plans on expanding.
- Cargill Mill at the Port of Albany, which produces feed for several farms and producers around the area, including Tractor Supply. We were able to tour the plant and ask questions about the feed and ingredients that go into the different products. A lot of the feed that was in the building was mixed up for Nutrena.
- **ReRun Farm**, which is a horse farm that takes Thoroughbred horses from the track when their racing career is over and slowly helps them make the transition from a racehorse to a horse used for pleasure riding. It takes time to transition a racehorse from the track to enjoy life in a pasture.

We also spoke with Donald Marsh from Nationwide. He talked about the need for farmers to plan for a transition to the younger generation and how to start those conversations. There were also several guest speakers who talked about public speaking, safety in agriculture, tourism, media interviews and fat-free meetings. I was able to go to two of the four meetings and both were very good and informative. At the end of the meetings, NYFB President David Fisher talked to us about how he is looking forward to this year and making more things happen in New York Farm Bureau and the importance of young farmers being involved in NYFB.
