#### MADISON COUNTY FARM BUREAU PROPOSED POLICY RESOLUTIONS

#### STATE

- 1. We support legislation to amend the vehicle and traffic law and the insurance law, in relation to increasing the minimum insurance coverage required for motor vehicles registered and/or operated within the state of New York.
- 2. We support increasing the payroll threshold for which a Code 59 review by the NYSIF would be triggered from its current level, we encourage the level to be adjusted annually and indexed to inflation.
- 3. We believe farms should continue to be responsible for paying for Worker's Compensation insurance for workers secured through a farm labor contractor.
- 4. We recommend that local governments not be granted the authority to make more stringent animal welfare/cruelty laws than existing state laws. (Reaffirmation of current policy, pg. 13, # 14 in the Animal Care section under General Issues)

Policy development is an important aspect of our county annual meeting. It helps develop and shape NYFB's policy, approved each December at State Annual Meeting, and is what guides NYFB members and staff to act on legislation and regulations dealing with farm business and landowner issues. If you have policy resolutions you would like to introduce, we will entertain resolutions from the floor this year at county annual meeting. Please bring any proposed resolutions in a typed format to the meeting.
