Vice President's Message:

Hi Farm Bureau Members,

First, I would like to welcome New Fulton County Farm Bureau Members: Matt and Beth Brower of Brower Farm in Mayfield.

When has anyone seen a year like this one when it comes to the weather? Regardless how the weather or the price you receive for your product is effecting your farming operation, Farm Bureau is keeping an eye on Albany and Washington. I know all of you have heard me say this is why I am a member, but I truly do believe that Farm Bureau is the only voice we have that understands how certain proposed legislation can harm or benefit our daily operation and bottom line.

Here are a couple of examples:

S.2721 (Alcantara)/A. 4189 (Nolan) This enacts the farmworkers fair labor practices act granting collective bargaining rights, mandating overtime after 40 hours, requiring a mandatory day of rest, and giving worker's compensation and unemployment benefits to farmworkers. Farm Bureau opposes such legislation.

S.2905 (Ritchie): This doubles the minimum wage tax credit for farmers to help offset increased labor cost on farms. Farm Bureau is in favor of this legislation.

Currently, I do not know at this time where these two pieces of legislation dealing with farm issues stand, but I do know your Farm Bureau is looking out for you.

We all have reasons for joining New York Farm Bureau. These are two of mine. If you have a neighbor or anyone you feel should be a member, go talk to them. Better yet, let one of your directors know!
