## 2018 Proposed Resolutions

Below is a list of some of the resolutions that will be discussed at the annual meeting. Resolutions will also be accepted from the floor the night of the meeting. If you have a proposed resolution that you would like to present from the floor at the County Annual Meeting, please have it written beforehand. This will ensure the meeting to run more smoothly.

#### State

#### Agricultural Issues/Agricultural Assessments

Should farm operations of less than seven acres used in agricultural production be able to generate less than the current \$50,000 in gross annual sales income to be eligible for agricultural assessment?

Washington County Farm Bureau Board had a lengthy discussion on this subject and requests input from their members. Their discussion involved the following arguments: In favor- smaller operations could be eligible sooner and could encourage more people to get into agriculture and preserve farmland even if the parcel is small. The \$50,000 threshold seems very high and perhaps a compromise should be reached. Opposed- The agricultural assessment should be for people who are farming to generate real income whether full or part time. If too many people receive the assessment, perhaps all of farming could be in jeopardy of losing the assessment especially if high value properties are suddenly eligible for agricultural assessment which would result in lost tax revenue for New York State. Keeping the current threshold may cause people to seek out farms that are larger than 7 acres because then they would have the lower \$10,000 threshold to reach and this could help keep more farms and farmland together instead of divided.

#### Agricultural Issues/ Animal Care/ Animal Cruelty Issues

We believe shelter should be defined in the animal cruelty statute as "shelter means adequate protection from the elements and weather conditions suitable for the age, species, and physical condition of the animal to maintain the animal in a state of good health. Shelter for livestock includes structures or natural features such as trees or topography."

#### Commodity Issues/ Brewery and Distillery Issues

We support a reporting requirement for New York ingredients for farm brewery licenses.

#### Economic Issues/ Private Property Rights

We believe unmanned drones operating under 400 feet should be treated and prosecuted as trespassing and invasion of privacy. Economic Issues/Taxes/ Real Property Taxes

We support extending RP-483, the exemption for agricultural buildings

Environmental Issues/ Wildlife Management/ Hunting Issues

We support prohibiting the use of unmanned aerial vehicles for hunting of wildlife.

*General Issues/ Education/ Post-Secondary Agricultural Education* 

We support individuals being granted only one CTE certification.

Ag Youth Scholarship Application submission deadline is Nov. 16.

New York Farm Bureau Promotion & Education Committee is encouraging high school seniors who have been involved with agriculture and plan on continuing studies in this field to apply. County winners are recognized at the discretion of their county Farm Bureau. For more info call 1-800-342-4143.
